Caleb Paine represented the United States in the ISAF meeting, along with many young Finn sailors and Olympic hopefuls that Corrine had assembled to press the personal side of the selection process.

The Rocky Mountain District is growing quickly and we applaud their efforts. I believe they are planning a regatta to capture the "coast to coast" traffic moving boats between regattas. We'll look forward to the *Rocky Mountain High*. ■

Southern California District Report

The SoCal fleet is definitely energized by the Bronze Medal performance of our very own Caleb Paine at the Rio Olympics, with younger sailors expressing interest in the Finn. September's Pacific Coast Championships, perfectly hosted by San Diego Yacht Club, brought seventeen entrants, with two teenagers (seventeen and fifteen). Henry Sprague and Scott Hoffman dueled it out to a tie on points, with Super Henry winning on head-to-head. Five-time PCC winner Darrell Peck had to settle for third, just two points off.

One week later Mission Bay Yacht Club graciously hosted the North American Masters, with twenty-one vintage Finn sailors competing over three days, one day in the bay and two outside. Eric Lidecis was simply untouchable with seven bullets and one second, followed by Henry Sprague and Darrell Peck.

Next up is Alamitos Bay Yacht Club's famed Turkey Day Regatta, always a favorite on the Finn circuit .■



Finn Sailing Development Report

There is an increase in people contacting the Finn class in this Olympic year, so there are a dozen sailors looking into the boat and several brand new boats and good second hand boats are coming to North America. We could actually use two more "loaner boats" to help channel interest in boat sailing into sailing a Finn.

The class boats loaned to promising sailors have all found candidates going into next year's sailing season. There is one boat on the west coast, one in southeast Florida, and one in the Midwest. And each boat has a designated person in charge of making sure it is fitted out properly and ready to go on the water. Rob Coutts manages Victoria Secret in San Diego; Peter Frissell and John Woodruff the Devoti on Lake Erie, and Charles Lindsay, a Devoti in Palm Beach. Lindsay is training for the Silver Cup in Hungary 2017.

The USAFA racing calendar is on the website: finnusa.org. The major events are all in August, so make your plans and transport options. We'll be able to transport up to six Finns and a coach boat with good planning. ■

2017 Nationals at Encinal YC: August 4-6, 2017

Finn California Lake Championship

Jeff Allen is working to revive the FINN Huntington Lake Regatta, AKA Finn California Lake Championship July 22-23 on the 2017 Calendar. We haven't sailed this Regatta in three years, due to the drought and last year due to lack of interest. The Regatta is sailed at Huntington Lake which is at 7000' elevation and due east of Fresno. The wind comes in at 11:00 am like clockwork at about 10 to 12 knots and the sailing is absolutely splendid. The Mercury Fleet does all the work for us in setting up the course and Matt Jones is always the PRO. There is a wonderful prime rib dinner served at the Lodge Saturday Night and the best part is the starting line is literally 3 minutes from the beach that we launch off of. Because there is no yacht club involved in this one Jeff Allen have served as the Regatta Chair for the last decade. This can be a wonderful family weekend and cabins are available through K&K Property Management. ■

2017 Finn World Masters: Barbados

June 2nd though 9th, 2017 are the dates for the 2017 Finn World Masters in Barbados. Although it may seem like a ways away, it will be upon us soon. Planning for a container shipment from the US is underway and making progress. The container shipping from Miami currently has six (possibly seven) boats signed up. The cost is right around \$1000 round trip with the six boats already committed. The boats will need to be dropped off at Florida Packers in Opa Locka, Florida (your responsibility) the first week in May (exact date to be determined) The sailors committed to sending a boat are as follows:
